

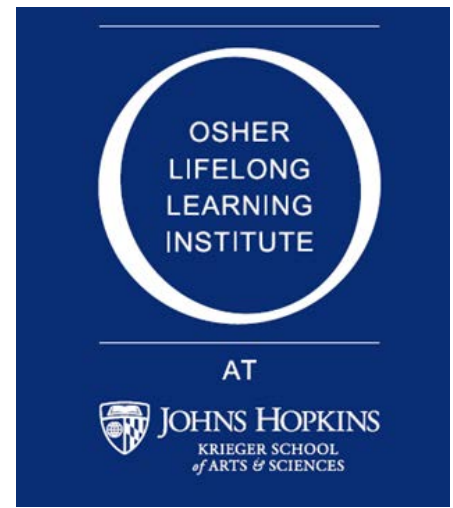

Marvin Kalb was senior advisor to the Pulitzer Center on Crisis Reporting (though he remains active), nonresident senior fellow at the Brookings Institution, Murrow Professor Emeritus at Harvard's Kennedy School of Government and anchor of *The Kalb Report*, a four-times-a-year broadcast from the National Press Club about journalistic ethics and practice. Marvin was a diplomatic correspondent for CBS News and NBC News for 30 years. He hosted *Meet the Press* in the 1980s. In addition, he was founding Director of the Shorenstein Center on Press, Politics, and Public Policy at the Kennedy School. He is writing his 18th book, his latest being *Assignment Russia: Becoming a Foreign Correspondent in the Crucible of the Cold War*.



Judy Woodruff has covered politics and other news for more than four decades at NBC, CNN and PBS.

At PBS from 1983 to 1993, she was the chief Washington correspondent for the MacNeil/Lehrer NewsHour. From 1984-1990, she also anchored PBS' award-winning documentary series "*Frontline with Judy Woodruff*." Moving to CNN in 1993, she served as anchor and senior correspondent for 12 years; among other duties, she anchored the weekday program "*Inside Politics*." She returned to the NewsHour in 2007, and in 2013, she and Gwen Ifill were named the first two women to co-anchor a national news broadcast. After Ifill's death, Judy was named sole anchor.

At NBC News, Woodruff was White House correspondent from 1977 to 1982. She is a founding co-chair of the International Women's Media Foundation, an organization dedicated to promoting and encouraging women in journalism and communication industries worldwide, the recipient of multiple journalism and broadcasting awards as well as 25 honorary degrees.
