APPLYING HUMAN-CENTERED DESIGN TO BEHAVIORAL INTERVENTIONS

PURPOSE:

Creating an informed intervention requires an understanding of the needs, constraints, behaviors, and wants of the end-user. Incorporating Human-centered design (HCD) practices can help.

CONTENT:

Johns Hopkins School of Nursing, Center for Innovative Care in Aging presents a two half-day immersive workshop in which participants will learn :

- HCD methods across stages of developing and testing behavioral interventions as well as inclusion of HCD from grant reviewer perspective.
- Participatory design research methods, data synthesis, ideation, and rapid prototyping, while also learning how to maintain equity, build humility and address power dynamics throughout the process.
